Basic Education: MD or DO

Minimal formal training: Successful completion of an ACGME or AOA accredited residency in pediatrics, followed by successful completion of an accredited fellowship in pediatric infectious diseases *and* current subspecialty certification or active participation in the examination process leading to subspecialty certification in pediatric infectious diseases by the ABP within 5 years of training completion.

Required current experience: Inpatient or consultative services for at least 24 pediatric patients as the attending physician and reflective of the scope of privileges requested during the past 12 months *or* successful completion of an ACGME accredited clinical fellowship within the past 12 months.

Additional Requirements: Maintenance of Basic Life Support certification

Core Pediatric Infectious Disease Privileges:

Admit, perform history and physical exam, evaluate, diagnose, treat, and provide consultation to newborns, infants, children and adolescents with acute and chronic infectious or suspected infectious or immunologic diseases, underlying diseases that predispose to unusual or severe infections, unclear diagnoses and uncommon diseases, and/or requiring complex or investigational treatments. Privileges include but are not limited to management of infections caused by viruses, fungi, bacteria and mycobacteria, parasites, and amoebae. May provide care to patients in the intensive care setting in conformance with unit policies. Privileges include the ability to assess, stabilize, and determine the disposition of patients with emergent conditions consistent with medical staff policy regarding emergency and consultative call services. Additional privileges include:

Administration of antimicrobial and biological products via all routes

Application and interpretation of diagnostic tests including microscopic analysis and molecular studies

Aspiration of superficial abscess

Lumbar puncture

Management, maintenance, and removal of indwelling venous access catheters in context of infectious complications or treatment of infectious conditions

Special Non-Core Privileges in Pediatric Infectious Disease:

If desired, noncore privileges are requested individually in addition to requesting the core. Each individual requesting noncore privileges must meet the criteria governing the exercise of the privilege requested, including training, required previous experience, and maintenance of clinical competence. Non-core privileges include:
